

Safety with Lottie Incursion

What is it?

A Safety with Lottie Incursion

- Is delivered by Knox City Council's School Crossing Team.
- Focuses on road safety skills around supervised school crossings.
- Is a 45 minute incursion
- There are two session types:
 - Suitable for Early Years – Grade 3:
 - Explores 'Stop, Look, Listen and Think', how to conduct yourself around school crossings, emergency situations and involves the school crossing mascot Lottie.
 - Suitable for Grade 3 – 6:
 - Expands on the 'Think' component, explores crossing roads at different scenarios and utilises a Giant Map for a travel planning activity (requires a room that caters for 7mx8m).

Setting up a Safety with Lottie incursion

Register

- Contact the School Crossing Team at Council (9298 8000) and register.

Schedule

- Select suitable times for the sessions to be delivered.
- For Preps, it is best to run a session at the beginning of the year.
- Early sessions can ensure Lottie is available in the morning during drop off times.

Deliver

- Run the Lottie Session(s).

Follow Up

- Teachers will be given the following materials:
 - 'Colour in Lottie' handouts;
 - 'Dropping them off and picking them up' safety booklet;
 - Parking at your school.
- Distribute to students and parents as in class activity or homework as appropriate.
- Monitor over the next few terms how many students are using the school crossing.
