- Climbing walls
- Monkey bars
- Track glide
- Balance chain (re-used from existing playground)
- Spiral climbers (re-used from existing playground)

2. Garden Beds

Garden beds surrounding the playspace to provide opportunities for tactile and sensory natural play and to create habitat for native birds and butterflies.
