# 1<sup>st</sup> Community Consultation

March – April 2016

# Introduction

Knox City Council is currently undertaking to prepare a masterplan for Templeton Reserve, Wantirna to upgrade amenities and facilities for the many users of this reserve.

Consultation with community groups and individuals has taken place to gain an understanding of park users' wants and needs, to better inform the designing, master planning and upgrade works for the reserve.

# Summary of findings

The pleasingly large number of responses to mailed out and online surveys (92), and good attendance at meetings indicates that the community is interested in contributing to the masterplanning process for Templeton Reserve. All the responses provided rational, reasonable and useful ideas for improving the park's facilities and condition.

In this section we note the items that were raised by many people/groups in their feedback. It was found that generally the same suggestions and feedback came from both individuals and stakeholder groups. For the full extent of responses please refer to the Stakeholder and Community Feedback sections.

The reserve is generally seen as a useful and necessary facility with many positive aspects including:

- The variety of facilities and opportunities for community activity;
- Its size, large open spaces and tranquillity;
- Its location, access points and being close-to-home for many park users;
- There being a playground;
- The opportunity for dogs to exercise off-lead;
- Availability of car parking;
- The amenity provided by the trees; and
- The basketball area.

The **most popular activities** the respondents use the reserve for are:

- Walking/jogging/tai chi;
- Children's play in the park and playground;
- Exercising dogs;
- Participating in and watching sports;
- Sitting and relaxing; and
- Waiting while children participate in sports.

The reserve is generally regarded to be in reasonable condition, however the main problem with the reserve's condition is seen to be the **poor quality of the playing field surface**.

Other significantly noted **<u>negative aspects</u>** of the reserve are:

- Lack of defined paths;
- Playground equipment needs updating, more variety, and refurbishment;
- Apparent vandalism and rubbish;
- Lack of public toilets;
- Dogs being off-lead throughout the park;
- Insufficient seating, particularly shaded or sheltered seating;
- Clubroom facilities are in a poor state;
- Lack of drinking water taps, for humans and dogs;
- Inadequate and dangerous carpark on game days
- The basketball area is too small and in poor condition;
- Lack of BBQ and picnic facilities; and
- Feeling unsafe, particularly in low light.

The most popular **<u>suggestions for improvements</u>** to the reserve include:

- Install a circuit path/better paths/accessibility;
- More seating / including spectator seating/ shaded seating;
- Variety/updated/extended playground;
- Improve condition of grassed oval;
- Install drinking taps/dog bowls;
- Exercise equipment;
- Improving trees/planting/shade/landscaping;
- Toilets;
- Picnic facilities/ BBQ;
- Improve access to and facilities at clubhouse;
- Extend basketball area/add netball ring/multi-sport area;
- Dog waste facilities;
- More/improved lighting;
- Stormwater harvesting/irrigation;
- More rubbish bins;
- Carpark improvements; and
- Fencing around playground.

<u>Conflicts of interest</u> between different park users only appear to occur for a small number of activities. These are being dogs exercising off-lead, game-day access to the reserve and the clubrooms being used for night time functions. Suggestions to mitigate or minimise the problems caused include:

- Creating dedicated and well-signed dog off-lead/on-lead areas.
- Prohibiting dog access to the oval.
- Rationalising the carpark to make manoeuvring easier.
- Providing signage and an information campaign to reduce noise from people attending and leaving events at the clubhouse.

# **Consultation Process**

A meeting was convened at the Templeton Reserve Tennis Club House on 7<sup>th</sup> March 2016 with external (non-council) stakeholder groups who use or have an interest in the reserve.

A preliminary community site meeting was held at the reserve on 19<sup>th</sup> March 2016 at which a concept masterplan was available to be viewed.

A community survey was mailed out with the concept design to 891 residents within close proximity to the reserve.

The community survey was also available online, as was the ability to email or telephone council officers to provide feedback and suggestions.

# External Stakeholder Groups Feedback

The consultation with stakeholder groups at the Templeton Tennis Club Building on March 7<sup>th</sup> 2016 was attended by Councillor Joe Cossari, representatives of Templeton Cricket Club, Templeton Orchards Preschool, Wantirna South Junior Football Club, Templeton Tennis Club, Step into Life, Council officers and consultant landscape architect.

The main topics discussed included the reserve's oval, playground, fitness stations/circuit path, carpark, disabled access, public toilets, club buildings, and tennis club.

### Templeton Reserve Oval

- Poor quality surface. Unsafe. Requires improvement.
- Recommend fencing the oval.
- Acknowledged new scoreboard construction.
- Open to idea of water harvesting for irrigation. Noted that work on existing sprinklers would be required.
- Improve vehicle access to oval.
- Improve lighting.
- Concern around dogs walking on oval. Recommend designated dog off-lead areas, and nodogs signage for oval.

### Playground

- Enquired about possibility of relocating playground to more central location for ease of parental surveillance between oval and playground.
- Provide lighting to playground.
- Provide fencing to playground.
- Requested variety of play equipment for varying age groups.

### Fitness Station / Circuit Path

- Provide fitness/exercise stations within the reserve.
- Provide new path along the north of oval.
- Discussion around moving cricket nets. Cricket club indicated they are best left where they are however, upgrade and improvements should be considered.

### **Carpark**

- Create a one-way "circuit" carpark to avoid manoeuvring conflicts.
- Noted that there is insufficient car parking on game days with cars parking on garden beds, nature strips and Templeton St.
- Accessible car space doesn't meet DDA standards.

### **Disabled Access**

- Currently paths within the reserve do not meet DDA access requirements.
- Consider viability of accessible public toilet

### Public toilets

- Currently no public toilets. Club house toilets are inappropriately set up.
- Recommend creating public toilets. Improving both male and female toilets to be comparable to other clubs and allow/encourage opportunities for community events.
- Requested public accessibility to potable water.

### Club buildings

- Strong desire/need to have club facilities improved to maintain sports club members and encourage community activity.
- Paths and access need to be improved.
- Shaded balcony/viewing area design was presented by club member.
- Existing steps at front of building considered dangerous.
- Garden beds and landscaping around building needs improvement to improve visibility.
- Request for shade structure and BBQ.
- Clean up dumped fill from north east area.

### **Templeton Tennis Club**

- Desire to build two new tennis courts due to increased membership. Possibly to south-west of existing courts.
- Discussion around creating some hardcourt multi-use courts from existing courts. Tennis club is not keen as the hard surface is more stressful for knees, joint and feet, considering senior members of the tennis club.

# Individual Community Feedback

Questionnaires were distributed to residents surrounding Templeton Reserve. 89 responses were received. Additionally 3 emails and one phone call were also received resulting in a total of 93 responses. This impressive number of responses indicates that the local community frequently uses and is very interested in the future of Templeton Reserve.

Following are the quantified responses received to the questionnaire, and inclusion of feedback provided by email and telephone.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Community Consultation

May-June 2016

## Introduction

Knox City Council is currently preparing a masterplan for Templeton Reserve, Wantirna to upgrade amenities and facilities for the many users of this reserve.

Taking into consideration the first round of community consultation a draft masterplan was prepared addressing park users' wants and needs.

A second round of community consultation was undertaken to review the draft masterplan.

# Summary of findings

38 individual written responses were received responding to the draft masterplan (May 2016).

The responses were overwhelmingly positive noting that most people's requests and suggestions had been addressed in the draft masterplan. Many respondents noted that there is nothing they would change about the masterplan. A variety of suggestions were made for minor variations and additions to the plan. Some of the suggestions had already been addressed, but may have been unclear or missed when perusing the documents.

One response noted that "you have no intention of reading or taking notice of a comments you will do what you want anyway".

The sporting clubs associated with the reserve also provided some further suggestions which are being considered and incorporated where possible.

# **Consultation Process**

Copies of the draft masterplan and the community survey were posted to residents surrounding the reserve and the clubs that use the reserve.

A community site meeting was held at the reserve on 4<sup>th</sup> June 2016 at which the draft masterplan was available to be viewed and staff were available to answer queries.

A meeting was held with the sporting clubs to receive their feedback and suggestions.

The community survey was also available online, as was the ability to email or telephone council officers to provide feedback and suggestions.

# Individual Community Feedback

Questionnaires were distributed to residents surrounding Templeton Reserve. 38 responses were received.

# Group/sports clubs' Feedback

- Football Club has suggested to build a new picnic area near the warm up areas behind the tennis courts and behind the couches boxes.
- Clubs have wanted to have fully enclosed playground and rubbish bins located around the play and picnic area.
- Clubs have suggested installation of more rubbish bins around the reserve.
- Requirement for the emergency access to the oval during the games was mentioned by Clubs.
- It was mentioned that lighting is required along the internal paths to improve safe accessibility.

- Cricket Club has raised their concerns for the coaches' boxes and shelter area as there are night time activities by youth. They have mentioned that they spotted broken glasses and needles around the area.
- Clubs have raised their concerns about safety issues during the night time around the adjacent properties. They have suggested that installation of CCTV cameras would be a potential solution. Council has agreed on contacting Council's Safety Officer to discuss further.
- Cricket Club has suggested installation of a fence around the oval to prevent balls rolling across to surrounding areas.

# What next?

Based on the feedback and suggestions received, the draft master plan for Templeton Reserve has had some changes made to it.

The first stage of works is being considered and will be documented in 2016.

- 3. Existing trees to be retained. Potential to enhance the bush character with new mulched beds under trees and additional planting.
- 4. Location of existing basketball ring. Potential activity area with new multi-sport surface and seating. Opportunity to create a connection to the area with pine trees for informal nature based play, including rocks and logs.
- 5. Investigate possible stormwater harvesting from existing drainage infrastructure.
- 6. Existing lawn area used for fitness classes. Potential to improve pedestrian access through this space. Possible additional planting to create separation of the park from the road and install new bollards match existing.
- 7. Existing playground. Potential to rejuvenate some of the existing structures and add new equipment, to cater for a wider range of age groups.
- 8. Potential picnic shelter with BBQs, picnic tables and a drinking fountain. Opportunity for more nature based play elements, including logs, rocks and a terraced amphitheater. Improve connection between Templeton Orchards Children's Centre and the play area.
- 9. Opportunity to expand the play space with some new play equipment, such as, a climbing frame or basket swings.
- 10. Opportunity to improve car park circulation, and provide wheelchair accessible spaces.
- 11. Opportunity to improve access to the club house building that accommodates tennis, football and cricket clubs. This may include new stairs and ramped paths. Potential to rejuvenate landscape around buildings with new seating.
- 12. Existing spectator terrace. Potential to enhance this area with additional seating in shade of ex ing trees, additional gravel pavement, additional rock-work and more tree planting for shade.

### EXISTING TREES / BUSHLAND AREA

Trees are within tree protection overlay. Incorporate trees into mulched beds, remove dead and dying trees, plant infill trees.

#### **EXISTING FENCE**

AMERSHAM

Post and rail fence to be removed. Place logs and rocks to create a vehicle barrier and to create a natural bushland edge to the tree reserve.

#### NEW CIRCUIT PATH

Proposed path around the existing oval / sports field, creating a walking and running loop connecting to the new path network. Provide bench seating at regular intervals.

#### THE EXISTING BUSHLAND Extend garden bed to the edge of the new circuit path, ensure clear lines of sight are maintained.

#### -EXISTING GRAVEL PATH Remove post and wire fence.

NEW MULTI-ACTIVITY AREA Youth oriented space with basketball, skateable objects and skate wave. Cut new surface into slope with graded lawn slope.

NEW OUTDOOR GYM EQUIPMENT Install a variety of equipment for training in aerobic fitness, strength and flexibility. Provide a drinking fountain close to circuit path and youth space.

EXISTING BASKETBALL RING To be demolished.

### EXISTING PINE FOREST

Trees to be retained and incorporated into mulched area, and provide logs and rocks as stepping stones and balance beams, as well as informal seating.
