- If sharing the Access Key with a participant, help the participant comprehend key points, consistently monitoring for level of understanding.
- If sharing the Access Key with a participant, contextualised photographs can be used to summarise information and experiences.
- If using the Access Key as a reflective tool, make sure to enjoy the pivotal link between experience and recall after the visit has taken place.
- Once the visit has taken place, revisit the Access Key to celebrate success.

Getting There

Welcome

Centre operating hours may vary depending on performances being held.

There is an undercover area located directly outside the main entrance.



Entry

The main entry located at the side of the building, adjacent to Mountain Highway.

It can be accessed from the carpark which is located at the rear of the building.

Access is via a 30-metre ramp with handrails at an approximate gradient of 1:21 (4.8%). Alternatively, the centre can be accessed from the carpark via a short stroll through the garden to a set of steps.

Entry to the centre is via glass automated doors with a clearance of 1600mm.

If you are a performer, please speak to your performance host to discuss entry points and times.

Staff

Reception and Candy Bar staff wear a lanyard with name tag.

Ushers wear black polo shirts. Polo shirts have a logo on the front and "Knox Arts Team" written across the back. Ushers work within the main theatre.

AV Technicians wear a black polo shirt with black pants. AV Technicians work in the AV room behind the scenes.



Toilets

Knox Community Arts Centre has two sets of public toilets.

Set One

Location: On the side of the theatre hall, within the emergency exit foyer.

Includes:

- unisex, accessible toilet with artificial lighting
- manual door opening inward. Door clearance of 900mm. Twist lock at 1090mm AFFL.
- cubicle space 2360mm x 2180mm
- grab bars to the right and behind toilet
- toilet height 440mm AFFL with right-hand transfer
- sink height 820mm AFFL with lever tap 980mm AFFL
- baby change area.

Set Two

Location: Within the main entry foyer

Includes:

• separate male and female toilets. Ambulant cubicle in female toilets.

Performers have their own set of toilets located within the dressing rooms.

The Box Office is located directly ahead of the main entrance on the left-hand side.


It is open one hour prior to the commencement of all performances.

Theatre Space Performances

When arriving at Knox Community Arts Centre to watch a performance:

- 1. If you have pre-purchased a ticket to a performance, please wait in the foyer until theatre doors open. If you have not pre-purchased a ticket, please purchase tickets at the Box Office.
- 2. Staff will ring a bell when the theatre doors open.
- 3. Proceed into the theatre via a small set of steps. Wheelchairs users can utilise the wheelchair lift to enter the theatre from the foyer. Lift with a gate clearance of 870mm.
- 4. Seat numbers are located on tickets. Ushers are available within the theatre if you require assistance.

This process may alter during privately operated performances run by community groups. If you have questions regarding access procedures, please contact the performance host.


Back Stage - Performers

When arriving at Knox Community Arts Centre as a performer in a production:

- 1. Enter via the rear or main entrance. The rear entrance is located behind the building, to the right-hand side of the access ramp. If you have access requirements, it is recommended you enter via the main entrance as the rear entrance is not fully accessible.
- 2. If entering through the rear entrance, the backstage area is located on the left-hand side, up a set of steps. If entering via the main entry see staff at the Box Office for directions.
- 3. Entry from the dressing rooms to the stage is via a door which is always open during performances with a clearance of 960mm.

Please be advised, the male and female dressing rooms are not wheelchair accessible. If you have access requirements, please speak to a staff member who will be happy to find an alternate space for you to change.

This process may alter during privately operated performances run by community groups. If you have questions regarding access procedures, please contact the performance host.

Room Hire

Knox Community Arts Centre has spaces available for hire. These spaces are suitable for theatre, seminars, meetings, dance concerts and more.

The venue incorporates two separate hire areas:

- supper room with a commercial kitchen (see page 18)
- theatre with a stage and tiered seating for 172 or flat seating for 100.

For bookings and information, please phone our centre on 9729 7287 or visit our <u>website</u> for information on how to book as well as equipment and services available.

Alternatively, see reception staff during office hours.

A tour of the venue can be provided prior to booking to ensure space is suitable.



Supper Room

The Supper Room is located directly ahead of main entrance and through the foyer.

Entry is via a manual door opening outward with a clearance of 910mm.

The Supper Room is multi-purpose function space, with AV equipment, meeting tables and chairs with backresets.

A commercial kitchen is available which includes a functional sink, microwave, fridge, oven, stove, crockery, toaster and tea/coffee making facilities.

Entry to the kitchen is via sliding door with a clearance of 830mm.

Accessibility

- Phone and internet booking systems.
- Fully accessible website.
- Free Wi-Fi available. Log into KCC Guest and accept the terms and conditions of use.
- Access ramp from carpark to main entrance with no landing platform.
- Clear signage indicating the entrance to the centre.
- Box Office desk height 905mm AFFL.
- Pen and paper for exchange of information located at Box Office.
- Staff available to read information to patrons if required.
- Acceptance of Companion Cards and Senior's Cards.
- Candy Bar desk height 900mm AFFL.
- Stools with backrests located within main foyer.
- Tables 1000mm high x 830mm wide within the main foyer.
- Water cooler located at the top of the theatre entrance steps for free drinking water at an operating height 750mm AFFL.

- Entry into theatre from the foyer via a steps.
- Wheelchair users can utilise the wheelchair lift with gate clearance of 870mm to enter the theatre from the foyer. See staff for assistance.
- Entry to the theatre via set of manual double doors opening outward.
 Singular clearance of 860mm. Double clearance of 1700mm. These doors will be always be open when entering the theatre for a performance.
- Theatre with two wheelchair accessible seating spaces on either side of the tiered seating. If you have access needs, please notify staff at the time of booking so they can accommodate you.
- Clear space for a person to manoeuvre a mobility aid throughout.
- See staff for storage of prams and mobility aids.
- Supper Room meeting tables 710mm high x 640mm deep x 1540mm wide.
- Supper Room kitchen bench height 900mm AFFL.

- Interpreter service available at Knox City Council. Please call the Translating and Interpreting Service (TIS National) on 131 450 and ask them to telephone Knox City Council on 03 9298 8000. Opening hours 8:30am-5pm Monday - Friday.
- Knox Community Arts Centre can attract large volumes of people and can sometimes become quite noisy. If you start to feel overwhelmed by levels of noise, please see staff who will be able to offer a quiet place to relax.

Safety

- Access ramp from carpark to main entrance with handrail on both sides and TGSI at top and bottom.
- Steps to main entrance with handrails located on both sides and centre.
 Steps with TGSI at top only.
- Glass entry doors with wide solid glazing band at 1040mm to 1120mm AFFL.
- Steps leading from foyer to theatre with handrail on both sides and TGSI at top and bottom.
- Steps on tiered seating within theatre without TGSI.
- Theatre steps with single handrail on either side of tiered seating. Steps in centre of tiered seating without handrail.
- Theatre step edges with lighting.
- Backstage area steps from theatre with handrails on both sides.

- Supper Room glass windows with solid metal beam offering contrast at 740mm to 920mm AFFL.
- Supper Room seating with colour contrast to walls and floor.
- All staff with Working with Children's Checks.
- See a staff member for first aid enquiries.
- Defibrillator located on the wall outside the entrance to the Supper Room.
- In the event of an emergency, staff will help and direct visitors. If there is to be an evacuation, visitors will be directed to the nearest exit and designated assembly area.
- Evacuation map located at the theatre entrance.
