Glossary

AFFL - Above Finished Floor Level.

MDLC – Mountain District Learning Centre.

TGSI - Tactile Ground Surface Indicator. A tactile ground surface to assist pedestrians who are visually impaired. Often found on footpaths, stairs and train station platforms.

For your Access Key to be successful, we recommend you follow these guidelines.

Access Keys are available online to help you prepare for your visit in advance.

Access Keys be read and shared in an environment free of distractions.

Access Keys can be read independently or shared with a friend, family member, carer or support worker to prepare for the visit.

If sharing the Access Key with participant, help participant comprehend key points, consistently monitoring for level of understanding.

If sharing the Access Key with participant, contextualised photographs can be used to summarise information and experiences.

If using the Access Key as a reflective tool, make sure to enjoy the pivotal link between experience and recall after the visit has taken place.

Once the visit has taken place, revisit the Access Key to celebrate success.

Parking

MDLC's main centre has one accessible parking bay.

It is located past the main centre entrance, on the left-hand side of the driveway.

Mini bus parking is also located past the main centre entrance, on the left-hand side of the driveway.

A drop off point is available directly outside the main centre entrance.

General parking for MDLC is located on The Avenue.

Parking restrictions apply.

There is also a council carpark near the intersection of The Avenue and Wyuna Street.

A four-hour time restriction applies.

There is limited parking available behind the MDLC Uniting Church site.

Access is via Alma Avenue.

It would be appreciated if these spaces could be left vacant for accessible use only.

Welcome

MDLC is open Monday to Friday 9am - 4pm.

MDLC comprises of two sites. The main centre at 13-15 The Avenue and the Uniting Church at 6 The Avenue.

The sites are conveniently situated approximately 50 metres apart on opposite sides of the road.

A small undercover area is available at the entrance to the main centre.

The Uniting Church is made up of three separate buildings; the Church, the Cottage and the Studio.

An undercover area is available at the Church entrance and both the Cottage and Studio have small undercover areas at the entrances.

Reception

MDLC reception is located at the entrance of the main centre.

Entry is via steps with handrail or a 6 metre access ramp with handrail.

Entry into reception is via an accessible glass automated door.

Staff are on hand to assist with any enquiries, bookings or to provide directions.

Payments can be made at reception.

Cash or eftpos is accepted.

There is a visual Communication Board at reception to support confident communication.

Resources and brochures are also available at reception.

For all other enquiries, please see reception staff.

Toilets

Main Centre

Location: Behind reception, to the left of the kitchen.

Includes:

Separate unisex accessible toilet with manual sliding door. Door clearance 750mm with easy to operate internal door lock.

Cubicle space 1400mm x 2260-mm.

Grab bars on wall to the left and behind toilet.

Toilet seat height 450mm AFFL with left-hand transfer.

Easy to operate lever control tap.

Separate unisex toilet.

There is an area to sit and wait in the kitchen.

Garden Craft Room Toilets

Location: Behind the main centre, outside Craft Room.

Includes:

Separate unisex accessible toilet with manual door opening inward.

Door clearance 900mm with easy to operate internal door lock.

Cubicle space 2450mm x 1640mm.

Grab bars on wall to the right of toilet.

Toilet seat height 450mm AFFL with right-hand transfer.

Easy to operate lever control tap.

Over toilet frame available.

Uniting Church Toilets

Accessible toilet location: Off the main Church hall.

Includes: Separate unisex accessible toilet with two entry doors and limited turning space for a wheelchair user.

Participants may require assistance with access. Church hall manual door opening outward with a clearance of 850mm.

Toilet manual door opening outward with a clearance 890mm with easy to operate internal door lock.

Cubicle space 1680mm x 1560mm.

Grab bars on wall to the left and behind toilet.

Toilet seat height 450mm AFFL with left-hand transfer.

Manual twist control taps.

Separate male and female separate toilets located in the church foyer.

There is an area to sit and wait in the church foyer.

The Cottage Toilet

Location: At rear of building

Includes: Unisex toilet.

Chairs with backrests and a table are available.

Participants with access requirements may need assistance with making hot drinks.

Classrooms

There are three general classrooms in the main centre.

Structured programs take place in theses rooms such as VCAL programs and other educational programs.

Some of our courses are accredited.

Each classroom has a teacher and some may have an educational support person.

Each room provides tables, wheelchair seating and chairs with backrests.

Stationary is provided or participants are welcome to bring their own.

Wi-Fi is available. Participants will be provided with a password.

Room 1 is located to the right of reception.

Entry is via a manual door opening inward with an 800mm clearance.

Capacity of this room is 15 - 20 people.

Room 2 is located in the main centre to the left of reception.

Entry is via a manual door opening inward with an 800mm clearance.

Capacity of this room is 10 – 12 people.

Room 3 is located to the left of reception.

Entry is via a manual door opening inward with an 800mm clearance.

Capacity of this room is 8 - 10 people.

Communal Garden

The Communal Garden is located behind the main centre.

For opening days and times, please see staff.

Access is on the left-hand side of the building.

Participants to follow a 15-metre sloping concrete path through the gate.

The gate remains open during centre hours.

Community members are welcome to come along to spend time in this relaxing space or enjoy some gardening activities.

Gardening equipment is available. Please see staff for assistance.

The produce from the garden is shared with the community.

Community members are also able to feed and pat the chickens.

Please see staff for assistance.

This space may sometimes be shared with classroom groups.

The capacity of this space is 20 people.

Craft Room

The Craft Room is located behind the main centre.

Access is on the left-hand side of the building.

Participants to follow a sloping 15-metre concrete path through the gate.

The gate remains open during class times.

Room entry is via a 5-metre access ramp with handrail and then a sliding glass manual door.

Groups and social programs are run in the Craft Room.

Participants can enjoy a range of arts and craft activities including scrap booking, paper crafts and mixed media art.

Tables, wheelchair seating and chairs with backrests are available.

Complimentary tea and coffee are available.

Capacity of this room is 10 people.

An accessible toilet is located at the entrance to the room.

Church Site

Church Hall

The Church Hall is located inside the Uniting Church, on the left.

First, Church entry is via an accessible manual door, opening outward.

Then, entry to the Church Hall is via accessible doors, opening outward.

The Church Hall is used for exercise classes and community lunches as well as other activities.

There are chairs with backrests and folding tables.

Complimentary tea and coffee are available.

Studio

Studio entry is via an 8 metre access ramp with handrail.

Room access is via a manual sliding door with an 880mm clearance.

Activities in the Studio include social and friendship groups.

Chairs with backrests and tables are provided.

Complimentary tea and coffee are available.

Capacity of this room is 20 - 30 people.

Cottage

Cottage entry is via a manual door, opening inward with a 770mm clearance.

Participants may require assistance with access.

Structured programs take place in the Cottage.

Chairs with backrests and tables are provided.

Complimentary tea and coffee are available.

Capacity of this room is 8 - 10 people.

Accessibility

An internet booking system is available for some courses.

Acceptance of Companion cards and Australian pension cards.

Wide self-opening reception entrance door.

Ramped and stepped access throughout.

Low height reception counter.

Visual Communication Board at reception.

Hearing Awareness Card at reception to support hard of hearing or Deaf visitors.

Staff available to read information if required.

Pen and paper for exchanging information available at reception.

Accessible parking for scooter users available – see reception staff.

Accessible storage area for mobility aids – see reception staff.

Accessible raised garden beds in Community Garden.

MDLC can provide some assistance to make classroom resources more accessible – please advise staff prior to attending if required.

Assistance animals welcome.

Main Centre: For participants who may require a break, a quiet space is available in the Kitchen, other areas of the garden or the seated area at the front of the centre.

Church site: For participants who may require a break, a quiet space is available in the Church foyer or front veranda.

ReadSpeak facility available online providing audio message about events, services and facilities.

Safety

Throughout both MDLC sites

Doormats placed on floor at entry/exit points and throughout buildings.

Varied terrain throughout (grass, concrete, paving stones, carpet, vinyl, wood). Some surfaces with slightly varied and uneven gradient.

No TGSI installed prior to steps or access ramps throughout with the exception of main entry/exit steps.

Signage for wet floors may be displayed.

If first aid is required, please see staff.

A defibrillator is located behind reception in main MDLC.

Main Centre

Handrail installed on entry/exit steps and access ramp.

TGSI installed prior to main entry/exit steps.

Additional lighting at entry/exit point when dark.

Contrast band on entry/exit door.

Emergency exits are signed.

Community Garden

Sloped concrete access pathway with gradient to garden.

Varied garden ground levels.

Protruding and overhead objects on pathways.

Craft Room

Handrail installed on access ramp.

Small raised edge at room entry/exit and toilet entry/exit.

Overhanging craft objects.

Throughout Church Site

Ground leading from Studio/Cottage to Church is sloped and uneven.

Church

Small raised edge into foyer toilet entry/exit.

Dulled lighting throughout.

Emergency exits are signed.

Cottage

Small raised edge at entry/exit.

Dulled lighting throughout.

Studio

Handrail installed on access ramp.

Small raised edge at entry/exit.

In the event of an emergency, staff will help and direct participants and visitors. If there is to be an evacuation, participants and visitors will be directed to the nearest exit and designated assembly area.
