Glossary

AFFL - Above Finished Floor Level.

TGSI - Tactile Ground Surface Indicator. A tactile ground surface to assist pedestrians who are visually impaired. Often found on footpaths, stairs and train station platforms.

For your Access Key to be successful, we recommend you follow these guidelines.

Access Keys are available online to help you prepare for your visit in advance.

Access Keys be read and shared in an environment free of distractions.

Access Keys can be read independently or shared with a friend, family member, carer or support worker to prepare for the visit.

If sharing the Access Key with a participant, help the participant comprehend key points, consistently monitoring for level of understanding.

If sharing the Access Key with a participant, contextualised photographs can be used to summarise information and experiences.

If using the Access Key as a reflective tool, make sure to enjoy the pivotal link between experience and recall after the visit has taken place.

Once the visit has taken place, revisit the Access Key to celebrate success.

Parking

General parking for Orana is located in the Orana carpark, at the front of the centre.

Orana has one accessible parking bay.

It is located at the front of the centre.

Street parking is also available in the neighbouring streets.

No restrictions apply.

Entry is via Neville street.

There is a 95 metre pathway from this carpark that leads to Orana.

It has a slight uphill gradient.

Mini bus parking is located either in the accessible parking bay or at the front of the centre, on Coleman Road.

Welcome

Orana is open 9am – 3.30pm Monday to Friday.

Reception and office staff are unavailable between 1230pm – 1pm; however, the centre will remain open during these times.

An undercover area is available in the carport, to the right of the entrance door.

Reception

Orana reception is located at the front of the building.

Entry is via an accessible automated glass door.

Staff are on hand to assist with any enquiries, bookings or to provide directions.

Payments can be made at reception.

Cash or eftpos is accepted.

There is a visual Communication Board at reception to support confident communication.

Resources, brochures, books and chairs with backrests are also available in reception.

For all other enquiries, please see reception staff.

For after-hours entry, participants please speak with the course facilitator for instructions on how to access the building.

Location - In the main building, through reception, at the end of the hallway.

One unisex accessible toilet with artificial lighting Manual sliding door. Door clearance 850mm with easy-to-operate internal door lock

Cubicle space 2080mm x 2360mm

Grab bars on wall to the right and behind toilet.

Folding grab bar on left of toilet. Contrast toilet seat at height 450mm AFFL with right-hand transfer.

Sink height 800mm with easy to operate lever control tap.

Two unisex toilets.

Training Room

The Training Room is located past reception, in the hallway, first door on the right.

Entry is via a manual door opening outward with an 800mm clearance.

This room has multiple uses such as exercise classes, senior groups and hospitality classes.

Chairs with backrests and tables are available and can be arranged as per room/activity requirements.

Participants are responsible for room set up and pack up.

Capacity of this room is 30 people.

There is a full commercial kitchen with a hands-free hygienic tap, fridge, microwave, oven, dishwasher and complimentary tea and coffee.

Please clearly label your belongings and respect belongings of others.

Participants with access requirements may need assistance with making hot drinks.

Please see reception staff for assistance or alternatively, use the tea/coffee station located in the hallway.

Please don't forget to pack up before you leave.

Participants will be provided with a password.

A complimentary tea and coffee station is available in the hallway.

Capacity of this room is 8 – 10 people.

Sometimes, this room may be opened up and shared with the adjoining room.

The adjoining room has a kitchen.

There is a kitchen with a fridge, microwave and complimentary tea and coffee.

Please clearly label your belongings and respect belongings of others.

Participants with access requirements may need assistance with making hot drinks.

Please see reception staff for assistance or alternatively, use the tea/coffee station located in the hallway.

Please don't forget to pack up before you leave.

The Portable

The Portable is located at the rear of the building.

This is a stand-alone building, detached from the

Entry is located on the left-hand side of the main building. It is via a 20m covered access ramp with handrail.

The Portable is located at the end of this ramp.

Entry is via a manual door opening outward with a 980mm clearance.

Exercise classes and arts and crafts run in this room.

Capacity of this room is 40 people.

There is a kitchenette available with a fridge and complimentary tea and coffee.

There are chairs with backrests and tables available.

Please don't forget to pack up before you leave.

Ramped and stepped access throughout.

Low height reception counter.

A visual Communication Board at reception.

Hearing Awareness Card at reception to support hard of hearing or Deaf visitors.

Staff available to read information if required.

Friendly helpful staff, trained in access awareness.

Pen and paper for exchanging information available at reception.

Adjustable, supportive seating with well-positioned armrests, built-in lumbar support and adjustable seat height and depth is available for flexible positioning throughout centre. Please see staff for assistance.

Accessible parking for scooter users available in the carport or main hallway.

Accessible storage area for mobility aids throughout each room.

Wide, clear internal and external walkways.

Training Room island bench at height 930mm AFFL, all other working benches at height 920mm AFFL, microwave operating height 1480mm AFFL and hands-free hygienic tap at operating height 1000mm AFFL.

Accessible tables in Computer Room.

An all ability keyboard available in Computer Room.

Accessible raised garden beds in front and back gardens.

Orana can provide some assistance to make classroom resources more accessible – please advise staff prior to attending if required.

Assistance animals welcome.

For participants who may require a break, a quiet space is available in reception or the gardens.

Safety

Throughout:

Doormats placed on floor at entry/exit points and throughout.

Varied terrain throughout (grass, concrete, paving stones, carpet, vinyl, wood). Some surfaces with slightly varied and uneven gradient.

No TGSI installed prior to steps or access ramps. Signage for wet floors may be displayed.

No contrast on glass doors/windows with the exception of reception entry/exit door.

Additional lighting provided in the evening.

Handrails on steps and ramps.

No lighting on steps.

If first aid is required, please see staff.

A defibrillator is located in hallway, after reception, on the left.

Emergency exits are signed.

Reception:

Contrast markings on glass reception entry/exit door.

End of hallway flooring in main building has a change of ground surface from carpet to vinyl with a small raised edge.

Training Room:

Concrete structural pillar in centre of room.

Computer Room:

Small raised edge at entry/exit.

Portable Room:

Sloped 5-metre concrete pathway from reception to Portable Room access ramp.

Small raised edge at entry/exit.

In the event of an emergency, staff will help and direct participants and visitors. If there is to be an evacuation, participants and visitors will be directed to the nearest exit and designated assembly area.
