
### **Wantirna Parking Management Plan**

\*Restrictions changed on public roads and carparks after Council has endorsed the plan (excluding Ashley St)









### **Wantirna Parking Management Plan**

### **Proposed Timeline**

The following timeline collates the actions identified as part of the investigation and consultation process for the development of the Wantirna Parking Management Plan and indicates the approximate time frames for the projects.

Action involving changes to parking restrictions on public roads can be managed by Council and completed within a 3 month period while actions involving advocacy are generally outside Council's jurisdiction.

Council to endorse Parking Management Plan

September 2020

# October- December 2020

- Implement parking restrictions in the Commercial Area (excluding Ashley Street)
- Consult with residents of Rachelle Drive about changes to parking restrictions in their street
- Inform residents close to proposed No Stopping changes (for safety reasons) on Yorminster Avenue and Thaxted Parade
- Ensure existing signage is compliant

January - June 2021

- Investigate a suitable location for a new accessible space in Wantirna Mall near the supermarket compliant with Australian Standards and DDA guidelines.
- Check No Stopping/No Parking restrictions on arterial roads

Ongoing advocacy

- Advocate for improved public transport
- Advocate for a review of the private carparks within the commercial area

### Ongoing

- Implement parking restrictions in residential area as requested or needed (including Ashley Street)
- Greater enforcement of parking restrictions subject to the Parking Compliance Strategy business case being adopted in the budget.
- Consider trial of inground sensors in some short term parking spaces subject to the Parking Compliance Strategy business case being adopted in the budget.
