Safety

The rate of reported family violence incidents in Knox has started an upward trend.



Of the 8,805 crime incidents in Knox in 2019, two thirds were property related.

The rate of drug incidents is higher in Knox with 304 incidents per 100,000 population compared to the Melbourne average of 242.

Knox has a high rate of youth engagement with 80% of youth fully engaged in work or study. However this decreased by almost 2% from 2011 to 2016.

Support for those is need was the second most important aspect of Knox for surveyed residents but less than half were satisfied with this aspect.

Health services and facilities are also of high importance and just over half of surveyed residents are satisfied with this aspect of Knox.
