1. Welcome and Introductions

Introductions for this meeting included welcoming any new members who were attending their first Bright

Ideas Network meeting. As this was an in-person meeting, we took the time to go around the room and introduce ourselves.

2. Guest Speaker: Anouk Hengeveld (KCC) – Waste Services Update

Anouk conducted a presentation to the group on Waste Services in Knox and the introduction of the new food and garden bin service this year. From July 2023, Knox residents can add food scraps to your green bin. 43% of Knox's current rubbish that goes to landfill is food. When food scraps break down in landfill it creates methane gas which contributes to climate change. By composting food, we can reduce the amount of greenhouse gas emitted from landfill. Anouk also explained the State Government banning that came into effect on 1 February 2023 of single use plastics. The following plastic items are now banned from sale or supply in Victoria: drinking straws, cutlery, plates, drink stirrers, cotton bud sticks, expanded polystyrene food service items and expanded polystyrene drink containers. There are medical exemptions to this policy.
