- Access Keys are available online to help you prepare for your visit in advance.
- Access Keys to be read and shared in an environment free of distractions.
- · Access Keys can be read independently or shared with a friend, family member, carer or support worker to prepare for the visit.
- If sharing the Access Key with participant, help the participant comprehend key points, consistently monitoring for level of understanding.
- If sharing the Access Key with participant, contextualised photographs can be used to summarise information and experiences.
- If using the Access Key as a reflective tool, make sure to enjoy the pivotal link between experience and recall after the visit has taken place.
- Once the visit has taken place, revisit the Access Key to celebrate success.

## Accessibility Features

A host of accessibility features will be available including:

- Changing Places (adult change facility), page 10.
- Chill Out Space, page 14.
- A lost children collection area is located next to the Event Info Hub.
- Event Program/Songbooks can be collected at the main entry gates from the Event Info Hub.
- A screen will be located on the side of stage to provide a better level of viewing.
- Auslan interpreters will be on-site. They
  will be located on the right-hand side of
  the stage throughout the main show and
  projected on to the large screen.
- Identification wristbands will be available.
  Wristband can be worn by children
  and parents can include mobile phone
  numbers in the event their child goes
  missing. Wristbands can be obtained from
  the Event Info Hub, or SES staff wearing
  orange uniforms.

- All Staff have Working with Children Checks.
- Event Staff will be on site in purple vests
- Event Wardens and Information staff will be on site in light blue vests.
- Security and police on site in uniform.
- Event Control is located at the Scout Hall (see map on page 6).



## Parking

Accessible parking for patrons with disability parking permits will be available.

Entry and exit for accessible parking will be via the Burwood Highway entrance.

Parking attendants will be available to direct vehicles. They wear high visibility vests.

Accessible parking will be open for patrons to come and go at any time throughout the event.

Accessible parking will be available within the reserve with access path connection to the oval and amenities. There will be approximately 30 bays.

General parking will be available in the adjoining streets and shopping precinct car parks around the event site.

A drop off point will be available near the library. Entry is via Burwood Highway. Please be guided by our traffic attendants.

A designated taxi/uber point will be located adjacent to the library.

# Entry

Gates will open at 4pm and entry is free.

There are two main **pedestrian** entrances; Brenock Park Drive and Lyndale Court. Brenock Park Drive provides direct access to the carols oval.

Lyndale Court provides direct access to the food court and restrooms including Changing Places.

A printed version of Knox Carols Songbooks will be available for accessible needs only at the Event Info Tent.

### Staff and Assistance

Carols staff wear Knox City Council t-shirts and staff lanyards.

SES (State Emergency Service) staff wear orange uniforms.

Security Guards wear a black uniform with high visibility vests.

St. John's Ambulance Australia (Victoria) will have one first aid station; located inside near Scout Hall.

St. John's Ambulance Australia (Victoria) first aid staff wear a green jumpsuit with the medical cross visible on their back.

Victoria Police will be on-site. They wear a navy uniform with high visibility vests



## Changing Places

Changing Places toilets have extra features and more space to meet the needs of people with severe and profound disabilities.

Location: Within Wally Tew Reserve, near the library.

#### Includes:

- All gender, fully accessible toilet and adult change facility.
- Door clearance of 950mm.
- Cubicle space 3650mm x 4740mm.
- Grab rails wall mounted behind.
- Wall mounted fold down grab bar fitted to either side of the toilet.
- 1 x adult change table electronically height adjustable foldable table Max load 200kg.
- CHS Healthcare Ceiling lift system & Stellar 440F hoist with max load 200kg.
- 1 x washbasin with lever operated tap.

Please remember to bring your own sling and ensure it is compatible with hoist. If there is any uncertainty, please do not use hoist.

Entry method: To access the Changing Places, you will require the MLA key. Alternatively, eligible users can borrow a MLA key from one of the Event Organisers. Please phone 0429 993 036.

#### TEMPORARY TOILET BLOCK

Location: Near the main entrance, at Brenock Park Drive, next to the Scout Hall.

#### Includes:

- 2 All gender Comfort- Inn Wheelchair Accessible Toilets.
- 40 portable toilets.

#### WALLY TEW RESERVE TOILETS

Location: Near the library.

#### Includes:

- All gender, accessible toilet.
- Automated sliding door. Door clearance 800mm with easy-to-operate internal door lock.
- Grab-bar on wall beside toilet.
- Separate men/boys and women/girl's toilets.
- Baby change area (within women/girl's toilets).

#### PARENT ROOMS

Location: on the northern side of the oval near First Aid.



During the show, Santa Claus will appear with friendly Christmas helpers.

#### **THEN**

At the end of the show, Bernard will invite all performers on stage to wave goodbye.

The show will finish at 9.30pm.

Please be advised that a fireworks display **will** take place at the end of the show.

The display will last for approximately 5 minutes and may include loud noises and bright flashing lights.

We recommend that guests who may be sensitive to noise or light prepare accordingly.

### **Fireworks**

There will be a fireworks display at approximately 9:30 pm for 5 minutes when the main carols concert has finished.

This display will be noisy and bright.

During the firework display some fireworks may shoot straight up before exploding, others whirl in a spiral, some shatter into thousands of sparks, others tumble like a water fall and some float like shimmering showers.

The firework display will be colourful and the fireworks may appear to spin, whisk, shoot or dart into the night sky.

The firework operation area is an exclusion zone!

- Wayfinding signage throughout event site.
- Electric wheelchair/scooter charging point located at the Scout Hall
- Permanent sealed paths assist patrons making their way around the festival site, including a new path connecting the accessible car park to the oval.
- There will be no provision of track matting for wheelchairs. However, area wardens will assist in keeping pathways clear and can walk alongside anyone who needs to move across the oval.
- Auslan interpreters present on stage throughout the main show program.
- Auslan projected onto screens.
- Assistance animals welcome.

# Safety

- Varied terrain throughout (grass, concrete).
- Additional lighting towers throughout venue with main access points well lit.
   Note, most lighting will be subdued during the main carols concert so as to not distract from the stage lighting.
- Obstacles throughout including marquees, chairs, rugs and rubbish bins.
- The stage is a large structure of around 12-metres in length. It is recommended patrons stay away from this immediate area as it is busy with staff, technical crew and performers.
- Cables may extend across ground surfaces (appropriate cable trays will be provided).
- Large speakers are located in main entertainment audience area. They can be extremely loud. It is recommended not to stand too close.
- Water station is located at the Brenock Park Drive entrance located at The Scout Hall and Brick Cricket Pavilion.
- Children must be supervised at all times.
- A lost children collection area and identification wrist bands available at Event Info Hub.

- If first aid is required, please see a St. John Ambulance Australia (Victoria) first aid attendee or visit the First Aid stations.
   Inside the Scout Hall.
- Defibrillator available for use located in the Event Control building.
- Security, emergency services and Victoria Police on-site.
- Patrolled pathways and carparks.
- Event organisers request all patrons move through the venue in an orderly manner, walking only.
- In the event of an emergency, staff will help and direct patrons to the nearest exit, which will likely be the same way you arrived. Please move to the designated assembly area.
